# **Student Demographics:**

The Portage Community School District (4K-12) serves approximately 2,135 students (993 elementary schools, 409 in middle school and 733 in high school) in one urban primary school (K-1), two rural elementary schools (1-5), two urban elementary schools (1-5), one middle school (6-8), and one high school (9-12). In addition, the PCSD offers an at-risk alternative high school (9-12).

## **<u>District/Community Demographics:</u>**

Portage is located in the south central part of Wisconsin on the scenic Wisconsin River approximately 35 miles north of the state capital in Madison. As county seat for Columbia County, the City of Portage has a population of over 10,000 residents and has been a transportation crossroads since Marquette and Joliet visited in 1673. PCSD is located 16 miles from a two-year satellite college campus (UW-Baraboo/Sauk County) and down the street from a satellite technical college (Madison College). Students who qualify for Youth Options Program area allowed to take courses at either campus to earn both high school and college credit.

### **Labor Market Projections:**

Columbia County saw a population increase of .4% over the last 6 years. The South Central Workforce Development Area, which includes Columbia County, is projected to have a net positive job growth of 8% over a 10 year period (2014-2024). This area is expected to add 23% of the state's new jobs by 2024. Almost 70% of the expected new jobs are concentrated in four industries: Education and Health Services (26%); Professional and Business Services (15%); Trade, Transportation and Utilities (12%); and Leisure & Hospitality (12%). Columbia County has an aging population and employers will compete to find skilled employees to meet their needs.
