Writing Grade 2

W.2.A Prewriting

- A.1. Students will:
 - a) Generate many ideas relevant to topic.
 - b) Consider genre/purpose.
 - c) Write with a clear intended audience.
 - d) Use student selected graphic organizers (i.e. word webs, lists, KWL Chart: What do you <u>Know</u>, <u>Want</u> to learn, What have you <u>Learned</u>, etc).
 - e) Structure ideas with a developed beginning, middle, and end.

W.2.B Drafting

- B.1. Students will:
 - a) Create meaningful text from pre-writing activities.
 - b) Write in complete sentences.
 - c) Write with clear ideas that are supported by details.
 - d) Reread own writing to generate and develop text with a purpose.
 - e) Write in grade-level genre with teacher modeling and support.
 - f) Use conventional spelling with many words and make near accurate attempts at many more.
 - g) Spell No Excuse Words correctly in daily writing.
- W.2.C Conference/Respond
- C.1. Students will:
 - a) Conference with teacher and peers about writing.
 - b) Conference with peers about writing (offer suggestions, stay focused and give positive feedback).
