Being Effective Reduces Discipline Problems

The teacher who has less discipline problems in the classroom:

- * Is well organized.
- * Gives students more time on academic tasks.
- * Tends to teach the class in large groups, giving less independent seat work.
- * Emphasizes academic achievement and expects that all students will achieve.
- * Selects and directs classroom activities.
- * Makes sure that students master one unit before moving on to the next.
- * Involves students in learning activities whenever possible.
- * Assigns tasks for which students have a high likelihood of succeeding.
- * Has a good grasp of the subject matter.
- * Has excellent presentation skills.
- * Monitors students at all times.
- * Gives adequate feedback to students.
- * Encourages cooperative learning and personal responsibility for work and behavior.
- * Encourages positive behavior and controls negative behavior.
- * Does not grade papers during class time.
- * Does not socialize or allow students to socialize in class.
- * Does not permit interruptions of class activities.
- * Does not permit negative behavior.
