Dealing With The Underachiever

The underachiever usually becomes involved in discipline problems. He/she will exhibit such behavior as:

- * Does not pay attention in class.

- 1. If a student is deficient in writing, give him/her oral examinations.
- 2. To prevent learning fatigue, incorporate frequent rest breaks during the lesson.
- 3. Make yourself available to the underachieving student for individual help.
- 4. Reward progress no matter how slight the progress is.
- 5. Remove as much pressure as possible from competing with other students.

Build on the student's successes so that he/she can increase his/her self-esteem. A student who feels good about his/herself will want to learn and in turn will cause you less problems in the classroom.
